LOUGHRIDGE, McDANIEL CONTRIBUTED MUCH

WMHS recently lost two long-time members with the passing of Nell Ruth Loughridge & Henrietta McDaniel.

Nell Ruth was the last surviving leader of the "original" WMHS which organized to save the Vann House in the 1950s. Even though she was a young mother at the time, she was involved in those efforts including the dedication in 1958, & she eventually served as a president of the group. It was only natural then that she helped reactivate the Society in 1976. Over the next three decades, she was hostess for countless historical society events, coordinated a number of meetings & programs, & coordinated the refreshments for the dedication of the Old Methodist Church in 1979. It was that day she was first heard to remark that she just knew that when she got to heaven, St. Peter was bound to ask her to make some punch and cookies!

Nell Ruth served on the Murray County History Committee that published the Murray County Heritage book in 1987. In 1988 she was instrumental in organizing the Friends of the Vann House; she served as vicechairman & as a trustee until 2006. She loved to meet & greet people at the Candlelight Tours! Nell Ruth was also a trustee for the Society, serving as trustee emerita at the time of her death.

Henrietta McDaniel was a mainstay of the WMHS for more than 30 years. She & her husband. Carlton, restored one of the most historic homes in Spring Place after a WMHS Holiday House next door; from then on, they did it all. They quickly became involved with the Old Spring Place Methodist Church project, helping coordinate the Spring Place Festival every year since its inception. With her excellent sewing & design skills, Henrietta was a natural for the Vann House Quilters group; her handi-
