# MARCH MEETING FEATURES EFFECTS ON LOCAL FAMILIES DURING THE CIVIL WAR

The March meeting of the Whitfield-Murray Historical Society will be Sun., Mar. 15, 2:30 p.m., at the archives. Speaker Lee White will discuss the effects of the Civil War on local families.

William Lee White is a park ranger at the Chickamauga & Chattanooga National Military Park where he gives tours & programs at the Chickamauga & Lookout Mountain battlefields. He is the author of Bushwhacking on a Grand Scale: The Battle of Chickamauga, part of the Emerging Civil War Series, as well as several articles & essays on topics related to the western theater. He also edited Great Things Are Expected of Us: The Letters of Colonel C. Irvine Walker, 10th South Carolina Infantry, CSA. He also contributes to the Emerging Civil War blog on a regular basis.

### McDANIEL ISSUES CHALLENGE GIFT


