SPANJER COMPLETES PUMP HOUSE WORK FOR EAGLE SCOUT AWARD

Alex Spanjer recently completed requirements for the rank of Eagle Scout. He was a member of Troop 98 at the First Christian Church in Dalton. His Scoutmaster was Tim McIntosh.

Alex's Eagle project was to repair the old pump house at the Crown Garden and Archives. He was assisted by fellow Scouts pictured above. The pump house used to house the pump that supplied water to the entire city of Dalton. Project work included replacing & painting the door & window frames, removing the paint from the brick, scrubbing & cleaning, painting the trim, replacing the window with plexiglass to prevent breakage, & building a gate so that the pump house can be easily seen from the outside. The Scouts also cleaned some of the overgrowth from the spring.
